Role Summary

The Apprentice Technical Coach is a key member of the British Curling Coaching team. Working across all three of our performance programmes, Olympic, Paralympic and Performance Foundation, the role encompasses day-to-day technical coaching at the National Curling Academy (NCA) with the potential to grow into team and competition coaching as development continues.

Key Responsibilities

- Working with established British Curling coaches and other staff to learn the skills of being a technical coach to elite athletes
- Delivering to pathway athletes – initially in a supervised (mentored) manner, with the aim of growing to delivering sessions unsupervised
- Working closely with an appointed mentor to refine insight, skills, and approach to coaching
- Learning new skills – technically, and then in time moving onto team coaching and potentially supporting athletes and teams in competition (including observing, recording, and taking match statistics).
- Assisting with performance planning and the collection and reporting of athlete 'What it Takes to Win' (WITTW) data.
- To contribute to the performance culture at the NCA and in doing so support the programme ambition for international success – delivered in the right manner – across all facets of the programme
- Commit to a learning and development plan and process – recognising that development to World Class standards of coaching requires time, commitment, and dedication.
